Movie Review

Parasite

By achieving the distinction of being the first Korean language film to be nominated to for the Best Picture category at the Oscars, the social satire 'Parasite' has created ripples around the globe and rightfully so. The film, directed by the South Korean auteur Bong Joon-Ho, is one of the most compelling genre films in recent memory which ultimately cannot be classified into any particular genre except for broadly being labelled as a satire on the social class structure. Though it begins like a con film where a poor family infiltrates a rich family, it soon mutates into something absolutely bizarre and yet hilarious and oddly satisfying. The film tricks the audience into believing that it may go in a certain direction but ultimately ends up taking a drastically different route in the end and strangely enough, it makes all the sense in the world.

Revealing much about the plot of the film may end up ruining the experience of watching this thrill ride. So here it goes without delving much into what really happens - Kim family's son lands an opportunity to work as an English tutor for the daughter of the wealthy Park family. The entire poor Kim family ends up taking jobs at the Park family but without letting their employers know that they are a family. What unfolds next is a riveting game of lies, treachery and hilariously tense moments which will keep the audience at the edge of their seats. The performances across the board are fantastic. All the actors enact their parts with absolute realism and fineness, and it would be tough to single out an actor who overpowers the others. It's a wonderful ensemble and hence proves that when actors leave behind their vanity, they could actually create magic by just giving the film what it demands.



The movie has universal themes of class divide and social structures that strike a chord with viewers and its exploration of the class struggle and greed will undoubtedly make the film stand the test of time. But the most refreshing thing about the movie is that it manages to create characters that you root for no matter what kind of tricks they engage in. The director subtly turns the tables and smashes cliches as the haves are seen as victims of the intelligent yet morally bankrupt actions of the have-nots. It may or may not bag the coveted Oscar trophy, but it's absolutely clear that when dust settles and let alone the year, when the decade comes to an end, 'Parasite' would top the lists of the most relevant and best films of the new decade.


Book Review

From here, Shiv Khera moves on to explain that the same thing applies inour lives. It is what is inside that counts. The inside that makes us go up is attitude.

The author says 'Failure is the highway to success' He says all the success stories in history are stories of great failures too. However, we see the bright side of the picture and say those people got lucky. The realisation that all those who made it to the top were ordinary people who had to suffer a lot before they saw the light of success would inspire any sensible mind.



This book will help you establish new goals, develop a new sense of purpose, and generate new ideas about yourself and your future. It will enable you, as the title suggests, to guarantee yourself a lifetime of success. The concepts in this book cannot be absorbed by casual browsing or by gulping the whole book down in one reading. It should be read slowly and carefully, one chapter at a time.
